Exciting progress is underway for two key trail projects in Tecumseh!

- ◆ Lesperance Trail (CR22 to CR42) The remaining asphalt work and site restoration will be completed this spring. The entire trail is expected to be open by fall 2025.
- ◆ Lesperance Trail (Riverside to First) Construction will begin this spring, extending the trail from Riverside Drive to First Street, as well as along Little River Blvd from Lesperance Road to Gauthier Drive.

ARE YOU HOSTING AN EVENT THIS SUMMER?

YOU MAY NEED A ...

SPECIAL OCCASION PERMIT:

A Special Occasion Permit (SOP) is needed any time liquor is offered for sale or served anywhere other than in a licenced establishment or a private place, depending on the type of event/activity. For example, an SOP is required for a Jack & Jill/Stag & Doe, wedding shower, backyard wedding celebration, etc. For information on when you need a permit, how to apply and how long it takes, visit tecumseh.ca/SOP.

NOISE BYLAW EXEMPTION:

If you plan on hosting an event this year, be sure to check our Noise Bylaw! The bylaw restricts loud music after certain hours, as well as construction noise, loud vehicles, animal noise, and domestic noise. The bylaw allows the Municipal Clerk to approve temporary noise exemptions. Learn more or apply at tecumseh.ca/noise.

GETTING MARRIED?:

Before getting married in Ontario, you must obtain a marriage licence. Marriage licences may be obtained at Tecumseh Town Hall by appointment, and you can start your application online. Licences are valid for 3 months from the date of issue for marriage ceremonies occurring anywhere in Ontario. Visit tecumseh.ca/marriage for more information!



Spring 2025 Construction Update

This year is another busy year for construction projects throughout the Town in fulfillment of the approved capital works plan. There will be related traffic disruptions and residents are asked for their patience and cooperation when they encounter intermittent lane closures and detours. Listed below are some of the Town's projects as well as County or City projects that are in or adjacent to Tecumseh. To view the Town's Capital Projects map, visit www.tecumseh.ca/capitalworks

Trail Projects:

- Lesperance Trail (CR22 to CR42): Work will restart this spring.
- Lesperance Road Trail (Riverside Drive to First Street, including select side streets): Construction begins Summer 2025.

Major Road Works:

County Road 42 Improvements:

 New CR19/CR42 roundabout and CR42 road construction (CR19 to Lesperance Road) by the County of Essex.

Banwell Road Improvements:

 City of Windsor will upgrade Banwell Road (Mulberry Drive to CP Rail).

Water & Wastewater Projects:

Tecumseh Hamlet Secondary Plan Area (Northwest Quadrant):

- Installation of trunk water and wastewater infrastructure (east of Banwell Road between CR22 and Intersection Road).
- Watermain Replacements:
 - Centennial & Woodbridge area
 - Brouillette Court

Stormwater Infrastructure:

 Continued construction on Scully/St. Mark's storm pump station and Riverside Drive trunk storm sewer.

Parks & Recreation Projects:

- Southfield Park: New splash pad, washroom, multi-use court, and perimeter trail.
- Lakewood Park South: New water feature, washroom, and pavilion.
- Rocheleau Park: New trail, naturalized area, and outdoor active play area.
- Pickleball Courts: Soundproofing at Lacasse and Shawanoe Parks.
